How COP29 can benefit India



The 29th Conference of Parties (COP29) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) has recently concluded with pivotal agreements and intense debates at Baku.

Held under the vision of intensifying climate crises and geopolitical tensions, COP29 has marked yet another milestone in global climate diplomacy. The conference focused on implementing the Paris Agreement—enhancing climate finance and addressing global disparities in climate responsibilities and capacities—with attending stakeholders ranging from governments to non-state actors.

The two standout issues were operationalising Article 6.4 of the Paris Agreement—centred on carbon markets—and setting a new global climate finance target under the New Collective Quantified Goal (NCQG). Both these discussions have underscored the disparity between developed and developing economies in tackling climate challenges.

This comprehensive analysis delves into the key outcomes of COP29, emphasising the implications for India in leveraging these outcomes for sustainable development and economic growth.

Indian Economy on the Transformational Paths

India Poised for Global Deep Tech Leadership

India is rapidly emerging as a global leader in deep tech, driven by advancements in AI, green hydrogen, space tech, and biotechnology, according to the "India's Deep Tech Revolution" report by Speciale Invest and Oister Global. These innovations are projected to bolster India's \$7 trillion economy by 2030. Also, the report highlights India's potential to capture 10% of the \$700 billion global space economy by the decade's end.



OECD Predicts Nearly 7% Growth for India

India's economy is set to grow at a steady pace of nearly 7% over the next two years, as outlined by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) in its latest economic outlook released on 4 December. This forecast reflects strong public and private investments, recovering agricultural output, and improving rural incomes buoyed by a favourable monsoon. The OECD revised its growth projection for India, estimating an average growth of 6.8% over the next three years. It also increased the FY26 growth forecast to 6.9%, from 6.8% in its earlier outlook.



Organic Food Exports to Hit \$450M

According to data shared in Parliament, India's organic food exports are anticipated to reach US\$447.73 million by November 2025, representing a shipment volume of 2,63,050 tonnes. These figures highlight a steady contribution of organic products to India's export economy, even amidst global market challenges. Export trends over the past five years reveal significant fluctuations, with the highest value of US\$1,040.95 million achieved in 2020-21. However, subsequent years have declined, with US\$494.80 million recorded in 2023-24, before the current fiscal year. Despite market fluctuations, India maintains over 1,000 certified organic processing units under the NPOP, supporting global demand for sustainable and health-focused products.



Startups Drive 1.6M Jobs in India

India's startup ecosystem has created over 1.6 million jobs, with 1.57 lakh startups recognized by DPIIT as of December 25. Over 73,000 startups feature women directors, highlighting growing gender diversity. With 100+ unicorns and strong growth in fintech, edtech, and e-commerce, India remains the world's third-largest startup hub.



BPCL Announces \$11 Billion Refinery Project

Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) unveiled plans to invest \$11 billion in a new refinery and petrochemical project in Andhra Pradesh. The facility will feature a refinery with a capacity of at least 9 million metric tons per year and an ethylene cracker, aiming to meet India's rising fuel demand and strengthen its position as a global refining hub.



Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme, ITEC FOR Croatian government officials



The Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme, ITEC for short, is the leading capacity building platform of the Ministry Of External Affairs, Government of India. Instituted in 1964, ITEC is one of the oldest institutionalized arrangements for international capacity building having trained more than 200,000 officials from 160+ countries in both the civilian and in the defence sector.

Government of India bears the entire expenditure for ITEC training in India, which includes airfare, tuition fees, living allowances, medical expenses, book grants.

The ITEC programme offers fully-funded in-person (or on-campus) ITEC courses at eminent training facilities and higher educational institutes spread throughout India.

Each year, MEA offers a calendar of ITEC Courses on various training themes related to public administration, industry, agriculture, management and entrepreneurship, power/renewable, development studies (rural, urban, sustainable), banking/finance/audit/trade, English language training and law/justice/police administration. These courses are of varying duration, ranging from a few months to 1 year, and provide an engaging training opportunity to get exposed to the latest developmental solutions and flagship schemes implemented in India.

Apart from covering the course fees and accommodation expenses, the ITEC scheme also provides one set of excursion/economy class air fare, gratis visa, a living allowance, book allowances, and medical facility. As part of the training, the ITEC scheme also includes an educational-cum-sightseeing study tour as an integral part. The study tour serves to familiarize the participants with Indian culture and history.

Vice President of the Committee for the Economy Ivica Lukanović received the Ambassador of India Arun Goel



Vice President of the Committee for the Economy Ivica Lukanović, Member of Croatian Parliament, received on 11the December Ambassador Arun Goel, with whom he discussed strengthening cooperation between the two countries, primarily in the areas of economy, tourism and culture. Ambassador Goel pointed out that Croatia ranks highly in India as a tourist country, has market potential for investment and export, and is also significant in terms of labor migration to it. He said that according to the latest data, 17 thousand Indian citizens have a residence and work permit in Croatia. - There are various experiences of Indians with agencies that mediate in the import of labor, but they all want to work, not come to Croatia and be there without a job, illegally, but participate in the environment they came to - Goel emphasized and expressed concern for the safety of foreign labor, since we are witnessing frequent attacks on them, which causes them fear, so he expects strong support, including diplomacy, in the integration of foreign workers. Vice President of the Committee Lukanović and Ambassador Goel agreed that Croatia is also important for India as a tourist destination. - In the first ten months of this year, around 50 thousand arrivals and 134 thousand overnight stays of Indian tourists were recorded, which is an impressive figure, said Lukanović. - Given the great interest of Indians in Croatia in terms of tourism, the procedures for issuing tourist visas should be accelerated, Goel believes. Regarding economic cooperation, Lukanović highlighted the Rijeka transport route for the transport of goods from India. - The Rijeka transport corridor will become increasingly stronger in the coming years and it is important that India also becomes familiar with this route as an option for the efficient transport of goods, he emphasized. Speaking about the safety of foreign workers, he believes that these are isolated incidents that should be sanctioned, but above all prevented. He believes that learning the Croatian language and getting to know each other's cultures and customs would contribute to the integration of foreign workers, so he believes that action should be taken on this issue and that migration should be seen as an opportunity for economic and social development. – The environment I come from is friendly towards foreign workers, and I personally have positive experiences with Indian workers, and it would certainly be nice to experience an Indian program as part of the Kastav Cultural Summer, to bring their culture closer to the local population - said Lukanović.

The interlocutors emphasized that both Croatia and India have made a strong contribution to the conclusion of agreements between the two countries in the fields of culture, education, technology, and sports, as well as to the Memorandum of Understanding on the defense industry, but that they still need to strengthen cooperation, especially with regard to Croatia's export potential, as well as by creating a friendly environment for entrepreneurs.

Ambassador Arun Goel met with head of the Croatia-India Inter-Parliamentary Friendship Group, Veljko Kajtazi

The head of the Croatia-India Inter-Parliamentary Friendship Group, Veljko Kajtazi, received on 19th December the Ambassador of India to Croatia, Arun Goel. MP Kajtazi Group presented Ambassador the work of the Inter-Parliamentary Friendship Group and emphasized the importance of mutual work on further strengthening economic cooperation, as well as on joint projects between India and Croatia.



Ambassador Arun Goel met on the 17th December the Zagreb City Museum Headmaster Mrs. Aleksandra Berberih Slana. The Zagreb City Museum is a general cultural and historical important city museum that systematically collects and processes objects from the city's past.
