


### Integration Experiences of Foreign Workers in Croatia: India in Focus

On Wednesday, 22nd October, a lecture and open discussion on the integration of Indian foreign workers in Croatia was held at HKD Napredak, organised by the Croatian Indian Society. The event started with opening remarks by the Society's president, Joginder Singh Nijjar.At the discussion, Pallavi Kararha, Head of Chancery, Embassy of India, Zagreb, spoke about the cultural similarities, differences, and how to bridge the gap, along with the challenges faced by many Indian workers in Croatia. Dr. Margareta Gregurović from the Institute for Migration Research presented data on the number of Indian workers, the sectors in which they are employed, and the administrative problems and challenges they encounter. Slide images revealed that over 20,000 Indian citizens have been working in Croatia in 2024, alongside 35,000 Nepali nationals. However, this only includes those whose work permits have been issued; a significant number of workers are still in the administrative process and are not yet included in official statistics

The Ministry of Ayush, Government of India has signed an agreement with the World Health Organization (WHO) to co-host the 2nd WHO Global Summit on Traditional Medicine on the theme "Restoring balance for people and



planet: The science and practice of well-being". The Summit will be held in New Delhi from 17th to 19th December 2025. The agreement signing took place in the presence of Union Minister of State for Ayush (IC), Prataprao Jadhav, and Secretary, Ministry of Ayush, during the 2nd Summit Planning Group Meeting convened to monitor activities and progress for the upcoming Summit. The Global Summit will serve as an important international platform bringing together experts, policymakers,

and stakeholders to advance the role of traditional medicine in global health and sustainable development. The Ministry of Ayush, in partnership with WHO, has reaffirmed its commitment to fostering evidence-based traditional medicine practices that contribute to human and planetary well-being.

## Google, Adani and Airtel join forces to build India's largest Al data centre in Vizag

Andhra Pradesh aims to host 6 GW of data-centre capacity by 2029, reinforcing its position as a key Al and digital infrastructure hub. Adani Enterprises Ltd., Alphabet Inc.'s Google and Bharti Airtel Ltd. have joined hands to establish India's largest artificial intelligence data centre in Visakhapatnam, marking a milestone in the country's emerging Al infrastructure. The initiative is part of Google's \$15-billion push into India's Al ecosystem, representing its biggest single investment in the country to date. The investment comes amid a wave of Al and cloud infrastructure expansion in India. Amazon Web Services (AWS) has pledged \$12.7 billion over five years to build new cloud infrastructure and support more than 100,000 full-time jobs annually. OpenAl, the creator of ChatGPT, is exploring partnerships to develop a 1 GW data centre in India after registering as a local entity. Meanwhile, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) has announced plans for a \$6.5-billion Al data centre and a dedicated Al subsidiary, underscoring a wider shift among Indian IT giants towards high-capacity Al computing.

## RBI says India's growth outlook remains resilient despite global economic headwinds

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has said that the ongoing flux in the global economy poses significant challenges to the global macroeconomic outlook, adding that India is not entirely insulated from these developments. However, it emphasised that the domestic economy remains resilient, supported by low inflation, solid corporate earnings, and a robust banking system. In its latest monthly bulletin, the central bank noted that these factors are helping sustain the economy's momentum despite global volatility. Earlier this month, the RBI raised its forecast for India's GDP growth to 6.8 per cent for the current financial year. It said that domestic growth drivers remain strong even amid external uncertainties. On the external front, the RBI addressed the impact of trade tensions with the United States. It acknowledged that India faces punitive tariffs on exports to the U.S., following President Donald Trump's insistence that these would remain unless India reduces its imports of Russian oil. Despite these tariffs, the central bank maintained that the overall impact on India's growth remains limited. It said that merchandise trade continues to show resilience, although exports to the U.S. saw a notable decline in September as the higher tariffs took effect.

#### Apple records highest-ever quarterly iPhone shipments in India

Apple Inc. achieved its highest-ever quarterly smartphone shipments in India, delivering 4.9 million iPhones during the July–September quarter of 2025, according to data from research firm Omdia. The milestone represents a 47% increase compared with the same period last year, marking Apple's strongest performance in the Indian market to date. The surge was attributed to robust festive season demand and the launch of the iPhone 17 series on 9 September. India now contributes 9% of Apple's global iPhone shipments, the largest share in the company's history, underscoring the country's rising importance in its global growth strategy.
