


The Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi interacted with Lex Fridman in a podcast

In a candid conversation, when asked about why he fasts and how he manages, the Prime Minister expressed gratitude to Lex Fridman for his gesture of fasting as a mark of respect for the PM. "In India, religious traditions are deeply intertwined with daily life", said Shri Modi, adding that Hinduism is not merely about rituals but a philosophy guiding life, as interpreted by the Honorable Supreme Court of India. He emphasized that fasting is a tool for cultivating discipline and balancing the inner and outer self. India launched Operation Brahma following the devastating earthquake that struck Myanmar

India launched Operation Brahma to provide necessary support, including Search and Rescue (SAR), humanitarian aid, disaster relief and medical assistance, following the devastating earthquake that struck Myanmar on 28th March 2025. Being the First Responder in times of crisis in the Neighbourhood, Operation Brahma is a whole-of-government endeavour by India to respond to widespread destruction in Myanmar. So far, six aircraft and five Indian Naval ships have delivered 625 MT of Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief (HADR) material.



India delivered the first tranche of HADR material to Myanmar, including 15 tonnes of supplies such as tents, blankets, essential medicines, and food – supplied by NDRF and the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare - using a C-130J aircraft, which landed in Yangon at 7:30 AM IST on 29th March 2025.

The second tranche, aboard two IAF C-130J aircraft, included 80 NDRF Search and Rescue (SAR) specialists, equipment, and relief material. One aircraft carried 17 tonnes of personal protective equipment, search & communication equipment, and rescue equipment, and the other carried 5 tonnes of HADR materials such as gensets, hygiene kits, food packets, essential medicines, kitchen sets, blankets etc. These aircraft landed in Naypyitaw on 30th March 2025.

The third tranche, involving two IAF C-17 aircraft, transported a 118 member Indian Army Field Hospital Team with over 60 tons of supplies, rapidly deployable surgical and medical shelters, water sanitation and hygiene services and most importantly women and child care services. These aircrafts also landed in Naypyitaw on 30th March 2025. The 200 bedded field hospital in Mandalay is now operational, treating patients and performing surgeries.

Indian Naval ships Satpura and Savitri, from the Eastern Naval Command - sailed for Yangon on 29th March 2025 carrying 40 tonnes of HADR material. These were handed over to the Chief Minister of Yangon on 31 March 2025. Indian Navy Ships Karmuk and LCU 52 from the Andaman and Nicobar Command sailed for Yangon on 30 March 2025, carrying 30 tonnes of relief material including HADR pallets comprising essential clothing, drinking water, food, medicines, and emergency stores. These were handed over at Yangon Port on 1 April 2025.


On 1 April 2025, in continuation of Operation Brahma, India dispatched further assistance including critical supplies to meet the immediate needs of the affected population. An IAF C-130J aircraft carrying approx. 16 tonnes of HADR material including vital supplies such as tents, gensets, drinking water, food, and emergency medicines, aimed at addressing the urgent needs of those affected by the disaster landed already in Mandalay. India stands ready to deploy more material assistance and resources to Myanmar depending on ground-level needs and requirements. India's ongoing efforts under Operation Brahma reflect its commitment to respond swiftly and in full measure to natural disasters in her Neighbourhood. As a First Responder, India stands with Myanmar, a key partner of our Neighbourhood First and Act East policy.



Indian Economy on the Transformational Paths

India to remain fastest-growing major economy with 6.5% growth in FY26

India is set to retain its position as the fastest-growing major economy, with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) projecting a Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth rate of 6.5% in 2025-26, driven by robust private investment and macroeconomic stability. The second advance estimate released by the Indian government also predicts 6.5% growth for 2024-25, with headline inflation expected to stabilize as food price shocks ease. The IMF's Article IV consultation highlighted that India's strong economic performance presents a key opportunity to implement structural reforms necessary to achieve its goal of becoming an advanced economy by 2047. The IMF emphasized the need for deeper structural reforms to boost private investment, job creation, and economic growth. Priorities include labour market reforms, strengthening human capital, and increasing women's workforce participation.



The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) recorded a new high in March, with transactions reaching 19.78 billion and a total value of Rs. 24,77,000 crore (US\$ 289.26 billion). This marks a 13% rise in value and a 14% increase in volume from February, primarily due to year-end financial transactions, according to the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). For FY25, UPI transactions surged 30% in value to Rs. 2,60,56,000 crore (US\$ 3.04 trillion) from Rs. 1,99,96,000 crore (US\$ 2.33 trillion) in FY24, while transaction volume rose 42% to 185.85 billion from 131.14 billion. Daily UPI transactions averaged 590 million in March, up from 575 million in February.

India could become the world's biggest electric vehicle manufacturer in the next five years

Union Minister of Road Transport & Highways, Mr. Nitin Gadkari, stated that India will become the world's largest electric vehicle (EV) manufacturer within five years. He emphasised that ongoing advancements in technology and Indigenous production of EVs will drive this growth. He further stressed that India's EV sector is witnessing substantial investment and innovation, positioning the country as a key player in the global automobile industry. He noted that cost reductions in lithium-ion batteries and increased local manufacturing will significantly enhance affordability and adoption. He also reaffirmed the government's commitment to promoting alternative fuels such as ethanol, hydrogen, and biofuels. With strong policy support and industry participation, India aims to lead the global transition towards sustainable mobility, reducing import dependency and enhancing energy security.

India's Defence Exports Reach Record High of €2.53 Billion in FY 2024-25

Defence exports have surged to a record high of €2.53 billion (Rs 23,622 crore) in the Financial Year (FY) 2024-25. This marks a growth of €272 million (Rs 2,539 crore) or 12.04% compared to the defence export figures of FY 2023-24, which stood at €2.26 billion (Rs 21,083 crore). The Defence Public Sector Undertakings (DPSUs) recorded a remarkable 42.85% increase in exports in FY 2024-25, highlighting the rising global acceptance of Indian defence products and the industry's integration into the international supply chain. In 2024-25, defence exports from the private sector amounted to €1.63 billion (Rs 15,233 crore), while DPSUs contributed €897 million (Rs 8,389 crore). The corresponding figures for FY 2023-24 were €1.63 billion (Rs 15,209 crore) and €631 million (Rs 5,874 crore), respectively. Through a post on X, Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh congratulated all stakeholders on this achievement. He emphasized that under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, India is progressing towards its ambitious goal of increasing defence exports to €5.36 billion (Rs 50,000 crore) by 2029.
