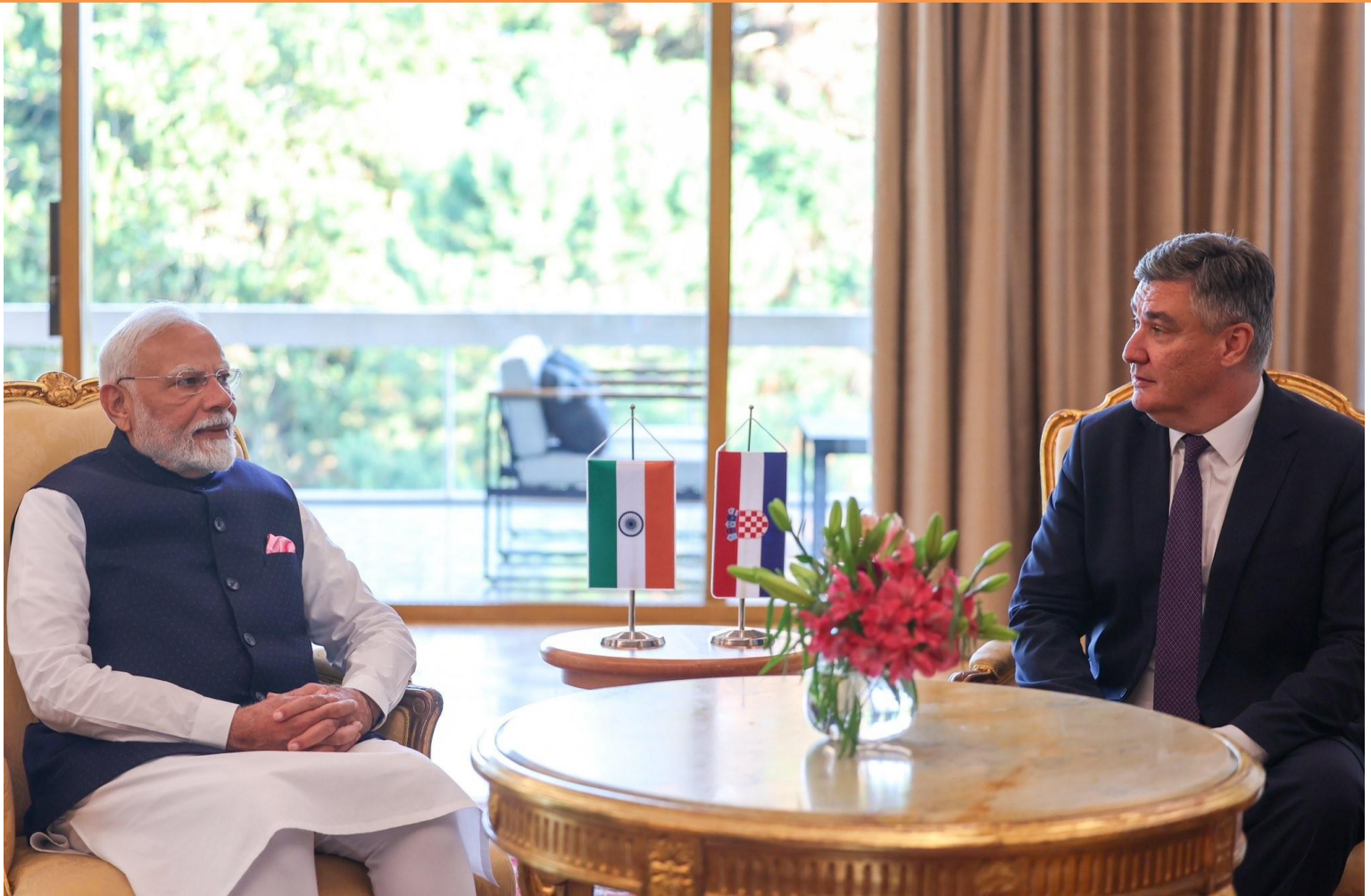

The two leaders held delegation-level talks. They engaged in wide-ranging discussions on various aspects of the bilateral partnership, including trade and investment, science and technology, defence and security, space, cultural cooperation, and people-to-people ties.

2. The two leaders held discussions on various aspects of bilateral relations. They reiterated their commitment to close and friendly ties between the two countries, based on shared values of democracy, rule of law and shared goal of international peace and stability. They expressed satisfaction at the diversification of bilateral cooperation in newer areas such as defence, start-up, sports and innovation. Prime Minister thanked President Milanovic for Croatia's strong support and solidarity extended to India in its fight against terrorism. The leaders also discussed close cultural linkages dating back many centuries which bind the two countries.

3. They also discussed regional and global issues of mutual interest. They noted that India-EU strategic partnership has deepened in recent times, and this would add value to India-Croatia relations in several ways.

Transcript of Special briefing by MEA on Prime Minister's visit to Croatia (June 18, 2025)

Special briefing by MEA on Prime Minister's visit to Croatia

18 June 2025

Shri Randhir Jaiswal, Official Spokesperson: Welcome everyone to this Special Briefing on the ongoing visit of the Prime Minister. We are also joined on the stage by Smt. Pooja Kapoor, who is Additional Secretary looking after Central Europe in the Ministry of External Affairs. With that I invite Secretary (West) to make his opening remarks after which he will take some questions. Sir, over to you.

Shri Tanmaya Lal, Secretary West: Namaskar, as you are aware, Prime Minister is completing his visit to Cyprus, Canada, and Croatia. And as was just mentioned, this has been an historic visit to Croatia by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. This was, in fact, this has been the first ever visit to Croatia by an Indian Prime Minister. Prime Minister Modi arrived in Zagreb earlier today on this official visit at the invitation of the Prime Minister of Croatia, His Excellency Andrej Plenković. The visit reflects the growing momentum in India-Croatia partnership. It also has importance in the context of the EU strategic partnership, and it shows India's growing ties with partners in Central and Eastern Europe. I would also briefly mention the elements of the program. Upon arrival, Prime Minister was received at the airport in a very special warm gesture by Prime Minister His Excellency Plenković. The two Prime Ministers held delegation-level talks. This was followed by signing of agreements. Prime Minister Plenković will host a Gala dinner in honor of Prime Minister Modi. The two leaders also took a walk together in the historic city centre of Zagreb. As we speak, Prime Minister Modi is also meeting and holding discussions with the President of Croatia, His Excellency Zoran Milanović. Earlier, Prime Minister was accorded a ceremonial reception at the St. Mark's Square in Zagreb, where he also signed the Book of Impressions. Prime Minister laid wreath at the monument to homeland. During the visit, External Affairs Minister Dr. Jaishankar also had discussions with his counterpart, Minister of Foreign Affairs, His Excellency Mr. Gordan Radman, over a working lunch. Earlier, upon arrival at the hotel, Prime Minister Modi received a special welcome that reflected the cultural and people-to-people ties between our countries. This included chanting of Sanskrit shlokas by Croatian friends, also a short Kathak performance by Croatian artists, a group of Croatian friends of India, and groups of Croatian students who are studying Hindi language at the Department of Indology at the University of Zagreb. And another group of students from Zagreb also welcomed the Prime Minister. Around 200 members of the Indian diaspora also welcomed Prime Minister on this landmark visit to Croatia.

India - Croatia Leaders' Statement (June 18, 2025)



1. At the invitation of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Croatia, H.E. Mr. Andrej Plenković, the Prime Minister of the Republic of India, H.E. Mr. Narendra Modi, paid an official visit to Croatia on 18 June 2025. This marked the first-ever visit of an Indian Prime Minister to Croatia to strengthen the growing momentum of high-level exchanges between the two nations.
2. Prime Minister Plenković and Prime Minister Modi had a comprehensive exchange of views on further advancing bilateral relations, India-EU strategic partnership and cooperation in multilateral fora. Both agreed that India and Croatia enjoy close and friendly relations, rooted in shared values of democracy, rule of law, pluralism and equality.
3. The visit of Prime Minister Modi has injected a fresh impetus into the bilateral partnership, highlighting the complementarities of the two economies, particularly in the areas of tourism, trade and technology. The two Prime Ministers welcomed the signing of: (i) MoU on Agricultural Cooperation; (ii) Programme of Cooperation in Science and Technology; (iii) Cultural Exchange Programme (CEP); and (iv) MoU to establish a Hindi Chair at the University of Zagreb.
4. The two leaders noted the importance of improving connectivity, including through the India–Middle East–Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) initiative. They agreed to expand cooperation in ports and shipping domains given the long maritime traditions of both countries. Both sides agreed to further explore the potential of Croatia serving as a Mediterranean gateway to Central Europe.
5. In this context, they also reaffirmed full respect for international law of the sea as reflected in UNCLOS, and for the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity, and freedom of navigation, to the benefit of maritime security and international peace and stability.
6. In the area of science, technology and innovation, the two Prime Ministers highlighted the importance of connecting scientific institutions and universities of both countries for joint research and development. Both sides expressed their willingness to facilitate exchanges of young researchers for long-term research collaborations and encouraged networking within the scientific community to share best practices and develop applied technologies.
7. The two Prime Ministers noted the signing of the 2023 Memorandum of Understanding on Defence Cooperation and agreed to advancing defence ties. Further emphasis will be placed on seeking opportunities for cooperation between national defence industries through collaboration and regular interactions.

8. Digital technology was recognised as another key area for cooperation. Croatian and Indian scientific ecosystems could benefit from strategic collaborations between incubation centres and start-ups working in sectors such as Healthcare-tech, Agri-tech, Clean-tech, Artificial Intelligence, Machine learning and Cybersecurity. The two Prime Ministers agreed on the need for strengthening India-Croatia Start-up Bridge in order to foster innovation and collaboration amongst start-ups.

9. While acknowledging the strong cultural exchange, both sides underscored the importance of deepening engagement in the cultural sector during the period 2026-2030. They recognised culture as a powerful tool for strengthening people-to-people ties between the two countries.

10. They recognised the importance of skills development and the mobility of personnel in supporting expanded engagement across various sectors of bilateral cooperation, and agreed on the speedy conclusion of a memorandum of understanding on workforce mobility between the two countries.

11. Prime Minister Modi thanked Prime Minister Plenković and Croatia for the support and solidarity extended in the aftermath of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu & Kashmir, India, on 22 April 2025. Both sides condemned terrorism and violent extremism in all its forms and manifestations, including transnational and cross-border terrorism. They reiterated their zero-tolerance approach to terrorism, rejecting any justification for such acts, under any circumstances. They emphasized that those responsible for the attacks should be held accountable and condemned the use of terrorists as proxies. They expressed their consistent position of supporting the full implementation of the UN Global Counterterrorism Strategy, key international conventions and protocols in this field, and relevant resolutions of the United Nations Security Council. They called for the disruption of terrorism financing networks, including through the UN, FATF and regional mechanisms, elimination of safe havens, dismantling of terrorist infrastructure, and bringing perpetrators of terrorism to justice swiftly. They also urged for concerted actions against all UN- and EU-designated terrorists and terrorist entities, associated proxy groups, facilitators and sponsors, including terrorists under 1267 UNSC Sanctions Committee.

12. The two Prime Ministers exchanged views on regional and global issues of mutual interest, including war in Ukraine. They expressed support for a just and lasting peace in Ukraine based on respect for international law, principles of the UN Charter and territorial integrity and sovereignty. The two leaders expressed concern about the deterioration of security situation in the Middle East and called for de-escalation between Israel and Iran. The leaders reaffirmed their commitment to promote a free, open, peaceful and prosperous Indo-Pacific built on international law and mutual respect for sovereignty and peaceful resolution of disputes underpinned by effective regional institutions.

13. The two sides reaffirmed their strong commitment to multilateralism and support for a rules-based international order. They emphasised the urgent need for reforms in the UN system, particularly the UN Security Council including its expansion in both permanent and non-permanent categories, to make it more inclusive, transparent, effective, accountable, efficient and better aligned with contemporary geopolitical realities.

14. The two leaders welcomed the renewed momentum in the strategic partnership between India and the EU, two of the largest democracies, open market economies, and pluralistic societies. They underscored the importance of concluding a mutually beneficial India-EU FTA within the course of the year, as agreed during the historic visit of the EU College of Commissioners to India in February 2025.

15. The Indian side expressed gratitude for the warm hospitality extended to them by the Croatian side. The two Prime Ministers expressed satisfaction at the outcomes of the visit, and reaffirmed their commitment to expanding the partnership between India and Croatia.

Indian Economy on the Transformational Paths

India's coffee exports double in a decade, touch \$1.8 bn in FY24

India's coffee exports have risen sharply over the past decade, recording a 125% increase to US\$ 1.8 billion in 2023–24 from just over US\$ 800 million in 2014–15, according to data released by the central government. Europe continues to be the primary destination for Indian coffee, with key importers including Italy, Germany, Belgium, the Middle East, South Korea, and Japan. India is currently the world's seventh-largest coffee producer, accounting for 3.5% of global output, and ranks fifth in exports with a 5% share. The country produces around 3.6 lakh tonnes of coffee annually, and the industry provides direct and indirect employment to approximately two million people, primarily in Karnataka, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu.



India posts \$28 billion trade surplus with G7, driven by smartphones and pharma exports

According to an analysis by Rubix Data Sciences, India's merchandise trade with the G7 countries has recorded a healthy 13% compound annual growth rate (CAGR) since FY21, with a strong trade surplus of \$28 billion in FY25. The latest report reveals that smartphone and pharmaceutical exports are the primary drivers of this surge in bilateral trade. Rubix said trade ties with the G7, the United States, the United Kingdom, Germany, France, Italy, Canada, and Japan showcase the growing confidence of Indian industries in tapping into the world's most advanced economies. India's bilateral goods trade with the G7 nations stood at \$248 billion in FY25. Exports were valued at \$138 billion and imports at \$110 billion, resulting in a trade surplus of \$28 billion. Notably, India sustained a trade surplus with four key bloc members: the U.S., the U.K., France, and Italy.



India's economy beats expectations with 6.5% growth in FY25

India's economy continued to show resilience amid global headwinds, with real GDP expanding by 7.4% in the final quarter of FY25, taking the full-year growth rate to 6.5%, according to CareEdge Ratings' latest Economic Pathways report. This outturn beat earlier expectations, though it decelerated from the 8.4% average growth recorded over the past two years. The report projects a growth rate of 6.2% for FY26, pointing to a stable yet moderated economic trajectory.

Central celebration of the International Day of Yoga 2025 Celebrated at Bundeck, Zagreb



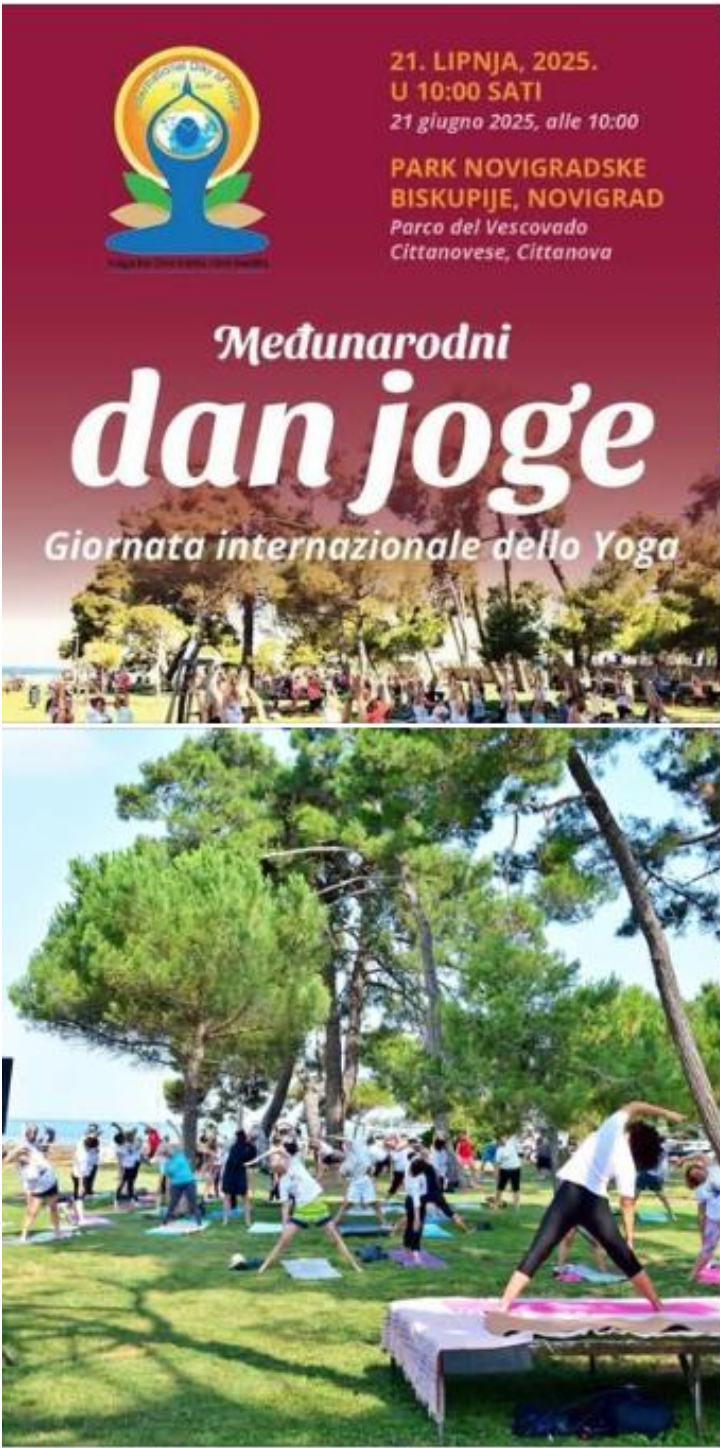
