PART I: INDIAN ECONOMY

News Features

1. Innovative low cost PPE developed by Indian Navy: In a major step towards rapid mass production of the Medical Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) developed by the Indian Navy, a patent has been successfully filed by the Intellectual Property Facilitation Cell (IPFC) of Ministry of Defence, in association with National Research



Development Corporation (NRDC), an enterprise under Ministry of Science & Technology. The low-cost PPE has been developed by a Doctor of Indian Navy, posted at the recently created Innovation Cell at Institute of Naval Medicine (INM), Mumbai. A pilot batch of PPEs has already been produced at Naval Dockyard Mumbai. The PPE is made of a special fabric which affords high level of protection along with high 'breathability' as against other PPEs available in the market and is, therefore, more suitable for use in hot and humid weather conditions as prevalent in India. The technology has also been tested and validated by ICMR approved Testing Lab.

2. India's online video market to touch US\$ 4 billion by 2025: The online video market in India is estimated to reach US\$ 4 billion by 2025, with subscription services contributing more than US\$ 1.5 billion while advertising accounting for US\$ 2.5 billion. The major contribution will be by Google's YouTube, followed by Disney+ Hotstar. Details of these projections are given under a report titled India



Intelligence and Insights: Disney+ Hotstar. As per the report by FICCI-EY media and entertainment industry report 2020, television advertising in India, on the other hand, is estimated to reach US\$ 5.1 billion by 2022.

3. **Star rating of garbage free cities:** According to the Star Rating of Garbage Free Cities 2019-2020 report, released by the Ministry of State for Housing and Urban Affairs, a total of six cities have been certified as 5-Star (Ambikapur, Rajkot, Surat, Mysuru, Indore and Navi Mumbai), 65 cities as 3-Star and 70 cities as 1-Star. The Star



Rating Protocol was launched by the Ministry in January 2018 to institutionalize a mechanism for cities to achieve Garbage Free status, and to motivate cities to achieve higher degrees of cleanliness. The protocol has been devised in a holistic manner including components such as cleanliness of drains & water bodies, plastic waste management, managing construction & demolition waste, etc. which are critical drivers for achieving garbage free cities. While the key thrust of this protocol is on Solid Waste Management.

Industry

According to Indian Central Statistics Office (CSO) data, India's industrial output contracted the most in at least two decades in April 2020 after the world's biggest lockdown to contain the new coronavirus pandemic froze economic activities. The Index of Industrial Production contracted 55.5% year-on-year in April, the most since at least 1996. That compares with a revised contraction of 18.3% in March 2020.

Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)

According to the Department for Promotion of Industry and Industrial Trade (DPIIT), during the first half of the 2019-20 financial year (April – September 2019), FDI into India was US\$ 26 billion, an increase of 15%. The maximum foreign inflows were in sectors that include

services (US\$ 4.45 billion), computer software and hardware (US\$ 4 billion), telecommunications (US\$ 4.28 billion), automobile (US\$ 2.13 billion) and trading (US\$ 2.14 billion). The foreign investment norms were relaxed recently by the Government in sectors such as brand retail trading, coal mining and contract manufacturing.

<u>Inflation</u>

Indian Central Statistics Office (CSO) data showed that the wholesale prices in India witnessed a deflation of 3.21% in May due to sharp decline in prices of fuel and power.

PART II: INDIA-CROATIA ECONOMIC RELATIONS

Bilateral Trade

In the period from Jan-March 2020 (for which local statistics are available) the total bilateral trade stood at Euro 55.84 million, i.e. India's exports worth Euro 49.56 million and India's imports worth Euro 6.25 million.
