PM Modi '3-day, 3-nation' Europe tour from May 2nd to May 5th

The first foreign tour of India in 2022 was unusual in its way, yet, as they say, a strong leader's vision connects likeminded individuals in an instant. Three days, eight world leaders, twenty-five engagements, several agreements, fifty global business executives, with one Prime Minister of India. Our Honourable Prime Minister Narendra Modi embarked on a three-day tour to Germany, Denmark, and France to advance India's engagement with Europe through trade, renewable energy, high-tech mobility, and the Indo-Pacific agenda. Several bilateral discussions were organized to strengthen ties in a variety of fields, including trade, energy, and green technology. Everything in international relations has to be seen in context, and the backdrop of the visit is the biggest crisis of this decade, the Ukraine Crisis, in which Europe has adopted a vehemently negative posture while India has consistently kept its neutral stance at every chance. The European tour began in Germany, where the German Chancellor and two other leaders met for bilateral talks at the sixth India-Germany Intergovernmental Consultations (IGC). It was the inaugural IGC and the first governmental meetings with Germany's newly formed government, followed by a Scholz business event. India and Germany signed a total of nine agreements, including a Joint Declaration of Intent (JDI) on Green and Sustainable Development Partnership, in which Germany promised to provide India with an advance commitment of 10 billion euros in new and additional developmental assistance until 2030. It is vital to note that our Prime Minister has always taken the chance to contact the Indian diaspora, and the highlight of the encounter this time was when a young Indian lad sang a patriotic song for Mother India in front of the Prime Minister. The event's second day began in Copenhagen, Denmark, and the visit will be remembered for the fact that Denmark's Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen came to the airport to greet the Indian Prime Minister. The second India-Nordic Summit was held as a follow-up event, and it was significant in and of itself since Katrin Jakobsdóttir of Iceland, Jonas Gahr Store of Norway, Maddalena Andersson of Sweden, and Sanna Marin of Finland were present to meet Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The second India-Nordic summit focused mostly on post-pandemic economic recovery, climate change, renewable energy, and the changing global security landscape. Agreements like the Declaration of Intent (DoI) on Migration and Mobility, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on cooperation in the fields of skill development, vocational education, and entrepreneurship, and the start of a ministerial-level energy policy conversation between the two countries.

The final meeting took place at the Elysee Palace, the French President's official residence, with President Emmanuel Macron and the French government. The camaraderie and links between India and France are exceedingly strong, as evidenced by Macron's hugging the Indian Minister soon after their meeting. Everything from global challenges to bilateral relations was covered. From an Indian standpoint, the three-day tour to Europe was a huge success, as evidenced by the fact that eight heads of state from different countries came to meet the Indian Prime Minister. It is consistent with our firm foreign policy, which our prime minister has promoted since his appointment.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi had a warm and productive meeting with H.E. Mr Joseph R. Biden, President of the United States of America, on 24 May 2022, in Tokyo. The meeting resulted in substantive outcomes which will add depth and momentum to the bilateral partnership. The meeting marks a continuation of the regular high-level dialogue between the two leaders who met in person in September 2021 in Washington D.C and interacted at the G20 and COP26 Summits thereafter. Most recently they had a virtual interaction on 11 April 2022. The India-US Comprehensive Strategic Global Partnership is underpinned by a shared commitment to democratic values, rule of law, and a commitment to uphold rules-based international order. The Leaders expressed happiness with the progress made across sectors in the bilateral agenda.

The two leaders welcomed the signing of the Investment Incentive Agreement which enables the US Development Finance Corporation to continue providing investment support in India in sectors of shared priority such as healthcare, renewable energy, SMEs, infrastructure etc. Both sides launched an India-U.S. Initiative on Critical and Emerging Technologies (iCET) to facilitate outcome-oriented cooperation. Co-led by the National Security Council Secretariat in India and the U.S. National Security Council, iCET would forge closer linkages between government, academia and industry of the two countries in areas such as AI, quantum computing, 5G/6G, biotech, space and semiconductors.

Noting that defence and security cooperation is a crucial pillar of the India-US bilateral agenda, both sides discussed how they can further strengthen collaboration. In this context, Prime Minister invited the US industry to partner with India to manufacture in India under the Make in India and Aatma Nirbhar Bharat or self-reliant India programmes which can be of mutual benefit to both countries. Taking forward their growing collaboration in the health sector, India and USA extended the longstanding Vaccine Action Programme (VAP) until 2027 to continue joint biomedical research which had resulted in the development of vaccines and related technologies.

To bolster the strong people to people linkages between the two countries, Prime Minister called for strengthening higher education collaborations which can be of mutual benefit. The Leaders exchanged views on regional issues of mutual interest including South Asia and the Indo-Pacific region, reaffirming their shared vision for a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific region. Prime Minister welcomed the launch of the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) and stated that India is ready to work closely with all partner countries to shape a flexible, and inclusive IPEF taking into consideration the respective national circumstances. The Leaders agreed to continue their useful dialogue and pursue their shared vision of taking the India-US partnership to a higher level.

NEWS ON INDIA

Inaugurating several completed projects and laying the foundation stone for fresh infrastructure projects worth Rs 31,500 crore, Prime Minister Narendra Modi listed his government's priorities and initiatives, including those to promote Tamil language and culture. Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin, in his address at the same event, highlighted the state's contribution to national economy to raise a number of long-pending demands such as payment of GST dues from the Centre.

Foreign direct investment (FDI) has been rising annually in contrast with the heavy selling by foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) in recent times. Gross FDI inflows were at \$83.6 billion in FY22, surpassing \$82 billion a year earlier. It stood at \$74.4 billion in FY20. Services and manufacturing sectors accounted for a major share of FDI in FY22, RBI said in its monthly bulletin. However, net FDI moderated to \$39.3 billion in FY22 from \$44 billion a year ago, due to higher outward investment by Indian entrepreneurs and repatriation by foreign investors, RBI said.



Narendra Modi, Prime Minister of India, visited Tokyo, Japan, for the Quad summit, a strategic dialogue between Australia, India, Japan and the United States of America (USA) on the 23rd May. Deepak Bagla, Managing Director (MD) and Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Invest India, part of the official delegation, accompanied the Prime Minister (PM). The PM met with key Japanese companies, including Fast Retailing, NEC (Nippon Electric Company) Corporation, Softbank Corporation and Suzuki Motor Corporation. The PM also chaired a business roundtable with 34 Japanese companies and key industry and economic bodies. The companies represented various sectors, including automobiles and auto components, electronics, steel, banking and financial services, and chemicals. Key business and industry bodies such as Keidanren, Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO), Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC), Japan-India Business Consultative Committee (JIBCC), and Invest India also participated in the roundtable.

World Economic Forum (WEF) Annual Meeting 2022 showcased India in great strength – with the largest presence on the promenade. There was a Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) lounge on one side and the six-state lounges of Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Telangana on the other. The Indian Ministerial delegation comprised Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs and Food and Public Distribution and Textiles, Government of India, Mansukhlal Mandaviya, Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Chemicals and Fertilisers, and Hardeep Singh Puri, Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Housing and Urban Affairs. The Government delegation also included Anurag Jain, Secretary, DPIIT, Amitabh Kant, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Niti Aayog, Rajendra Ratnoo, Joint Secretary (JS), DPIIT and Deepak



FOCUS: India GDP Growth




India's economy grew 4.1 percent year-on-year in the January-March period of 2021-22 (Q4 FY22), even as the rate of growth slowed sequentially for a third straight quarter with the Omicron wave-induced restrictions and high commodity prices weighing on economic activities. The National Statistics Office pared down the overall growth estimate for FY22 to 8.7 percent from the 8.8 percent projected in February. In FY22, all sectors except trade, hotels, and communication services were above the pre-pandemic levels of FY20.

Growth in private final consumption expenditure, or private spending, decelerated sequentially in Q4 to 1.8.

Government spending, however, picked up to grow at 4.8 percent, supporting overall growth. Gross fixed capital formation, which represents investment demand in the economy, slowed to 5.1 percent. India is fastest-growing major economy shows UN report



India is still the fastest-growing major economy even as the Ukraine conflict impacts the global gross domestic product (GDP), according to a UN report. India is projected to grow by 6.4 percent in 2022, slower than last year's 8.8 percent, due to higher inflationary pressures and uneven recovery of the labor market curbing private consumption and investment, the UN report shows. The UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs said in its World Economic Situation and Prospects (WESP) report released that the war in Ukraine has upended the fragile economic recovery from the pandemic, triggering a devastating humanitarian crisis in Europe, increasing food and commodity prices, and globally exacerbating inflationary pressures, PTI reported.

India is the fastest-growing economy among the G-20 nations, besides boasting of several other achievements included in the start-up environment, said Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Addressing graduating students of the Indian School of Business (ISB) here, Modi said last year the country attracted a record amount of Foreign Direct Investments. "Today, India is the fastest developing economy in G-20. India is in the second position when it comes to internet users. India is in the second position in the global retail index. India has the third-largest start-up ecosystem in the world. There are several such achievements," Modi said.

US surpasses China as India's biggest trading partner in FY22 at \$119.42 bn



The US surpassed China to become India's top trading partner in 2021-22, reflecting strengthening economic ties between the two countries. According to the data of the commerce ministry, in 2021-22, the bilateral trade between the US and India stood at \$119.42 billion against \$80.51 billion in 2020-21. Exports to the US increased to \$76.11 billion in 2021-22 from \$51.62 billion in the previous fiscal year, while imports rose to \$43.31 billion as compared to about \$29 billion in 2020-21. During 2021-22, India's two-way commerce with China aggregated at \$115.42 billion as compared to \$86.4 billion in 2020-21, the data showed.

Exports to China marginally increased to \$21.25 billion last fiscal year from \$21.18 billion in 2020-21, while imports jumped to \$94.16 billion from about \$65.21 billion in 2020-21. The trade gap rose to \$72.91 billion in 2021-22 from \$44 billion in the previous fiscal year. Federation of Indian Export Organisations Vice President Khalid Khan said India is emerging as a trusted trading partner and global firms are reducing their dependence only on China for their supplies and are diversifying their business into other countries like India. "In the coming years, the bilateral trade between India and the US will continue to grow. India has joined a US-led initiative to set up an Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF) and this move would help boost economic ties further," Khan said. Rakesh Mohan Joshi, Director of the Indian Institute of Plantation Management (IIPM), Bangalore, too said that India is home to 1.39 billion people with the world's third-largest consumer market and the fastest-growing market economy with an unparalleled demographic dividend that provides enormous opportunities for the US and Indian firms for technology transfer, manufacturing, trade, and investment. "Major export items from India to the US include petroleum polished diamonds, pharmaceutical products, jewelry, light oils and petroleum, frozen shrimp, made-ups, etc. whereas major imports from the US include petroleum, rough diamonds, liquified natural gas, gold, coal, waste and scrap, almonds, etc," Joshi said.
