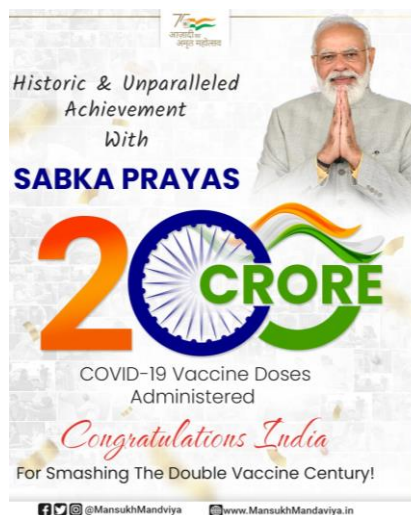

## PM Narendra Modi inaugurates 296 km-long Bundelkhand Expressway in UP

Bundelkhand Expressway will ensure seamless connectivity and further economic progress in the region.



### **Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday inaugurated the 296-km-long Bundelkhand Expressway, which passes through seven districts of Uttar Pradesh**

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi visited Uttar Pradesh on 16th July, 2022 and inaugurate Bundelkhand Expressway at Kaitheri village in Orai tehsil of Jalaun district. The government has been committed to enhancing connectivity across the country, a key feature of which has been the work towards improvement in road infrastructure. A significant endeavour towards this was the laying of foundation stone for the construction of Bundelkhand Expressway by the Prime Minister on 29 February, 2020. The work on the Expressway has been completed within 28 months and it will now be inaugurated by the Prime Minister. The 296 Km, four-lane expressway has been constructed at a cost of around Rs 14,850 crores, under the aegis of Uttar Pradesh Expressways Industrial Development Authority (UPEIDA), and can later be expanded upto six lanes as well. It extends from NH-35 at Gonda village near Bharatkoop in Chitrakoot district to near Kudrail village in Etawah district, where it merges with the Agra-Lucknow expressway. It passes through seven districts, viz. Chitrakoot, Banda, Mahoba, Hamirpur, Jalaun, Auraiya and Etawah. Along with improving connectivity in the region, the Bundelkhand Expressway will also give a major boost to economic development, resulting in the creation of thousands of jobs for the local people. Work on the creation of industrial corridor in Banda and Jalaun districts, next to the Expressway, has already been started.

**PM NARENDRA MODI: In the passing away of Mr. Abe, Japan, and the world have lost a great visionary. And, I have lost a dear friend. A tribute to my friend Abe San...**



Shinzo Abe - an outstanding leader of Japan, a towering global statesman, and a great champion of India-Japan friendship - is not among us anymore. Japan and the world have lost a great visionary. And, I have lost a dear friend. I first met him in 2007, during my visit to Japan as the Chief Minister of Gujarat. Right from that first meeting, our friendship went beyond the trappings of office and the shackles of official protocol.: Our visit to Toji temple in Kyoto, our train journey on the Shinkansen, our visit to the Sabarmati Ashram in Ahmedabad, the Ganga Aarati in Kashi, the elaborate tea ceremony in Tokyo, the list of our memorable interactions is indeed long. And, I will always cherish the singular honour of having been invited to his family home in Yamanashi prefecture, nestled among the foothills of Mt. Fuji. Even when he was not the Prime Minister of Japan between 2007 and 2012, and more recently after 2020, our personal bond remained as strong as ever. Every meeting with Abe San was intellectually stimulating. He was always full of new ideas and invaluable insights on governance, economy, culture, foreign policy, and various other subjects. His counsel inspired me in my economic choices for Gujarat. And, his support was instrumental in building Gujarat's vibrant partnership with Japan. Later on, it was my privilege to work with him to bring about an unprecedented transformation of the strategic partnership between India and Japan. From a largely narrow, bilateral economic relationship, Abe San helped turn it into a broad, comprehensive one, which not only covered every field of national endeavour, but became pivotal for our two countries' and the region's security. For him, this was one of the most consequential relationships for the people of our two countries and the world. He was resolute in pursuing the civil nuclear agreement with India – a most difficult one for his country – and decisive in offering the most generous terms for the High Speed Rail in India. As in most important milestones in independent India's journey, he ensured that Japan is there side by side as New India accelerates its growth. His contribution to India-Japan relations was richly recognised by the conferment upon him of the prestigious Padma Vibhushan in 2021. Abe San had a deep insight into the complex and multiple transitions taking place in the world, the vision to be ahead of his time to see its impact on politics, society, economy and international relations, the wisdom to know the choices that were to be made, the capacity to make clear and bold decisions even in the face of conventions and the rare ability to carry his people and the world with him. His far-reaching policies - Abenomics - reinvigorated the Japanese economy and re-ignited the spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship of his people. Among his greatest gifts to us and his most enduring legacy, and one for which the world will always be indebted, is his foresight in recognising the changing tides and gathering storm of our time and his leadership in responding to it. Long before others, he, in his seminal speech to the Indian Parliament in 2007, laid the ground for the emergence of the Indo Pacific region as a contemporary political, strategic and economic reality - a region that will also shape the world in this century. And, he led from the front in building a framework and architecture for its stable and secure, peaceful and prosperous future, based on values that he deeply cherished – respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity, adherence to international law and rules, peaceful conduct of international relations in a spirit of equality and shared prosperity through deeper economic engagement. The Quad, the ASEAN-led forums, the Indo Pacific Oceans Initiative, the India-Japan Development Cooperation in the Indo-Pacific, including Africa and the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure all benefited from his contributions. Quietly and without fanfare, and overcoming hesitation at home and scepticism abroad, he transformed Japan's strategic engagement, including in defence, connectivity, infrastructure and sustainability, across the Indo Pacific region. For that, the region is more optimistic about its destiny and the world more confident about its future. During my Japan visit in May this year, I had the opportunity to meet Abe San, who had just taken over as the Chair of the Japan-India Association. He was his usual self - energetic, captivating, charismatic and very witty. He had innovative ideas on how to further strengthen the India-Japan friendship. When I said goodbye to him that day, little did I imagine that it would be our final meeting. I will always be indebted for his warmth and wisdom, grace and generosity, friendship and guidance, and I will miss him dearly. We in India mourn his passing as one of our own, just as he embraced us with an open heart. He died doing what he loved the most – inspiring his people. His life may have been cut short tragically, but his legacy will endure forever. I extend heart-felt condolences on behalf of the people of India and on my own behalf to the people of Japan, especially to Mrs. Akie Abe and his family. Om Shanti.

## The northern belt of India

UNESCO World Heritage sites 'Taj Mahal', one of the 7 Wonders of the World! Not to miss is its ever-changing shade of moonlit marbles from midnight to dawn, beautified with the 'Pietra dura' technique which is the art of chiseling colorful-precious stones in architecture. The monument was built as a memorial by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan for his late wife Mumtaz Mahal. The name is believed to be derived from the Persian language: 'taj' means crown and 'mahal' means palace, making it the palace of the crown.



If you want to revisit the ancient glory of India, then the Albert Hall Museum in Jaipur, Rajasthan is the place to be! It is a quick 5-hour drive from the capital Delhi. This panoramic shot of the outer wing of the oldest museum in Rajasthan is something that will mesmerize you while the rich collection of artifacts inside will captivate you. The museum has a large collection of jewelry, gems, ivory works, and coins and denominations from ancient times. The museum is located in the Ram Niwas Garden, where you can sit and enjoy the chirping of birds of various species and afford a moment of total relaxation.

Also known as the Temple of Divine Love, Prem Mandir is dedicated to Goddess Radha and Lord Krishna, and Lord Rama and Goddess Sita. It was shaped and designed by Jagadguru Shri Kripaluji Maharaj in 2001 and is spread over 54 acres. Considered one of the most beautiful and elegant structures in Vrindavan, this Italian white marble temple is dedicated to major events in the life of Lord Krishna, and the interiors depict these scenes, including the raising of Govardhan Hill. The large musical fountain, where a pleasant sound and light show is held in the evening, is one of the most interesting attractions of this religious place.



The Rumi Darwaza (Gate) is an incredible structure that stands imposingly between Bara Imambara and Chota Imambara in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh.



One of the most fascinating sights in Jaipur is the beautiful Jal Mahal or Lake Palace. Light sand-colored stone walls and dark blue water make a beautiful contrast. The palace seems to be floating in the middle of Man Sagar Lake, where tourists can enjoy its magnificent exteriors.



## Central belt of India

Jodhpur has a lot for every adventure lover. Something that no tourist should miss on their tour to Jodhpur, Rajasthan is the desert safari. Hit the sand for an exciting desert safari and explore the world of wildlife. Spot blackbucks, foxes, and blue bulls as you pass through the vast deserts of Jodhpur. Camel tours are also available. Drive through the dunes, watch the sunset and take home memories to last a lifetime.

Varkala is a peaceful and quiet village located on the outskirts of the Thiruvananthapuram district. It has several tourist attractions which include a beautiful beach, a 2000-year-old Vishnu temple, and an Ashramam - Sivagiri Mutt located a little further from the beach. Papanasam Beach (also called Varkala Beach), which is ten kilometers away from Varkala, is famous for its natural spring. Which is considered to have medicinal properties. It is believed that bathing in the holy water on this beach cleanses the body of impurities and the soul of all sins; hence the name 'Papanasam Beach'.



The tomb of Sher Shah Suri is in the Sasaram town of Bihar state. His tomb is an example of Indo-Islamic architecture, this red sandstone mausoleum (122 ft high), stands in the middle of an artificial lake. The tomb stands at the center of the lake on a square stone plinth with domed kiosks, and chhatris at each of its corners, further, there are stone banks and stepped moorings on all sides of the plinth, which is connected to the mainland through a wide stone bridge

The Great Flamingo is a beautiful bird and happens to be the state bird of Gujarat. It is the largest bird in the flamingo family and is the most widespread among all flamingos which are generally found in different regions of Africa, Asia, and Europe. In Asia, their distribution range includes the coastal areas of India as these birds prefer saltwater lagoons in coastal areas. They also inhabit large alkaline and saline lakes. Flamingos live, mate and feed in large flocks, which can consist of a thousand individuals.





## Southern belt of India

Jog Falls, a major attraction in Karnataka, is located in the Shimoga district of Karnataka. Also known by the alternative names of Gerusoppe Falls, Gersoppa Falls, and Jogada Gundi, it is one of the highest waterfalls in India. During monsoons, one can see a breathtaking view of the falls with rainbows coming now and then.



The 65-meter-tall Statue of Equality in honor of the saintly philosopher Sri Ramanujacharya, on the outskirts of Hyderabad, Telangana. It is spread over a yard of 40 hectares and is decorated with 'Panchaloha' (gold, silver, brass, copper, and zinc). Set atop a 16-meter-tall building called Bhadra Vedi, it has floors dedicated to a Vedic digital library and research center. Sri Ramanujacharya was a philosopher known for his ideals of equality. Born in 1017 CE, he is revered throughout the world as a Vedic philosopher and social reformer.

## NEWS ON INDIA

**Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya said that the country's massive Covid-19 vaccination drive, which has delivered over 200 crore doses so far, tells an "incredible story" of in-house research and production.** Speaking at the Express Adda, Mandaviya said: "This was an incredible story of Atmanirbhar Bharat because the research happened in India, manufacturing happened in India, and the administration happened... using all indigenous things, we have reached the target of 200 crore. We have already administered the first dose to 98 per cent of people over the age of 18 years and second dose to 91 per cent. And, now the precaution dose is happening. Not only did we protect our country, we supported other countries as well. The vaccine might be (available) for \$20-25 in other countries, we provided it at \$3-4."



**Prime Minister Narendra Modi appealed to people to strengthen the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' movement by hoisting or displaying the national flag in their homes between August 13-14.** In a series of tweets, he said this movement will deepen our connect with the tricolour and noted that it was on July 22 in 1947 that the national flag was adopted. "Today, we recall the monumental courage and efforts of all those who dreamt of a flag for free India when we were fighting colonial rule. We reiterate our commitment to fulfil their vision and build the India of their dreams," he said.



**Karnataka has topped among the major states in the Niti Aayog's India Innovation Index 2021, a comprehensive tool for the evaluation and development of the country's innovation ecosystem. Telangana and Haryana are next in the list.** Among the North-Eastern and hilly states, Manipur is the best performer, followed by Uttarakhand and Meghalaya. For the Union territories and city-states, Chandigarh is the top performer, followed by Delhi. New India's technical textiles market is projected to grow at the rate of 8% as compared to the global growth rate of 4%.



**India's GDP to grow 7% this fiscal: FICCI survey.** Industry body FICCI said India's economy is estimated to grow 7 percent in the current fiscal. FICCI's Economic Outlook Survey (July 2022) also said the policy rate of the Reserve Bank of India is expected to reach 5.65 percent by the end of this fiscal.

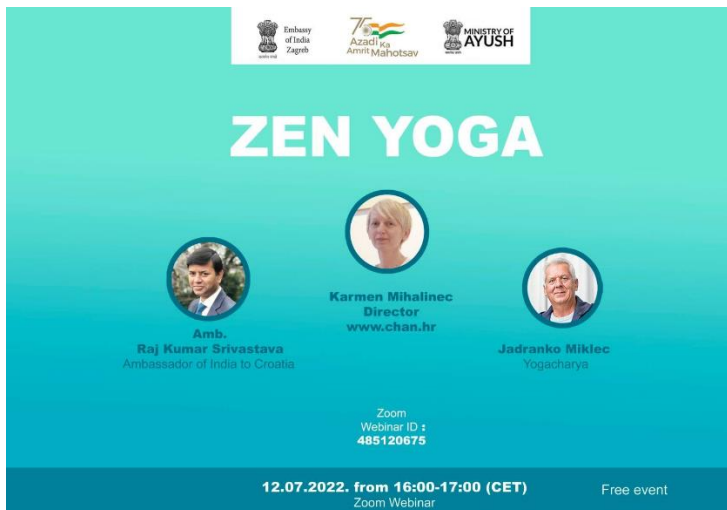

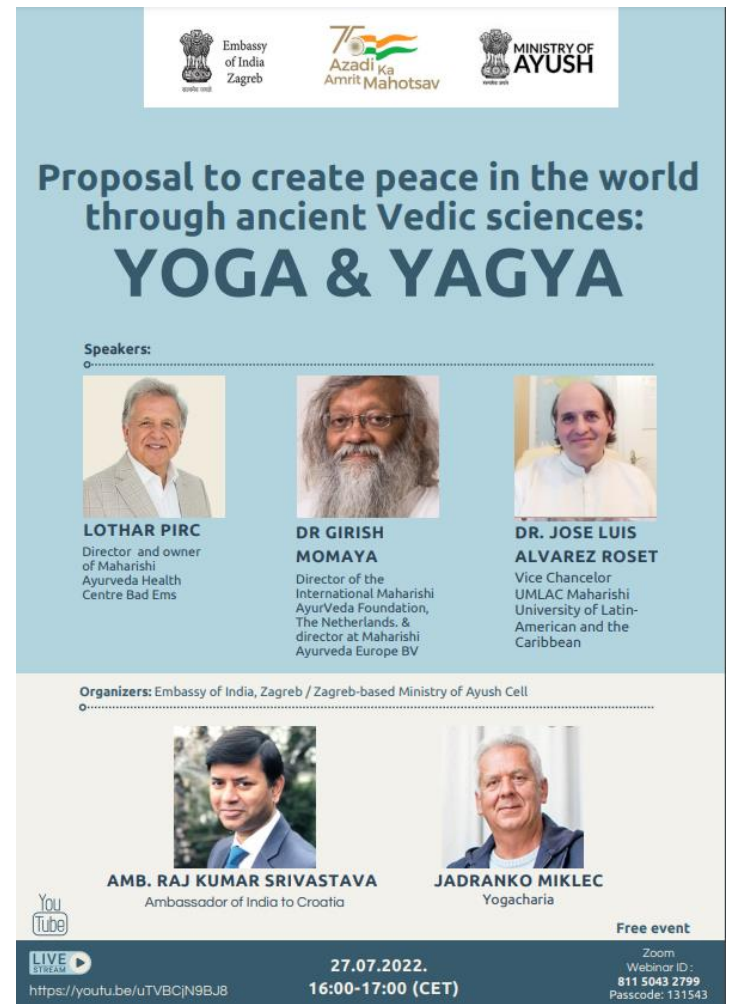

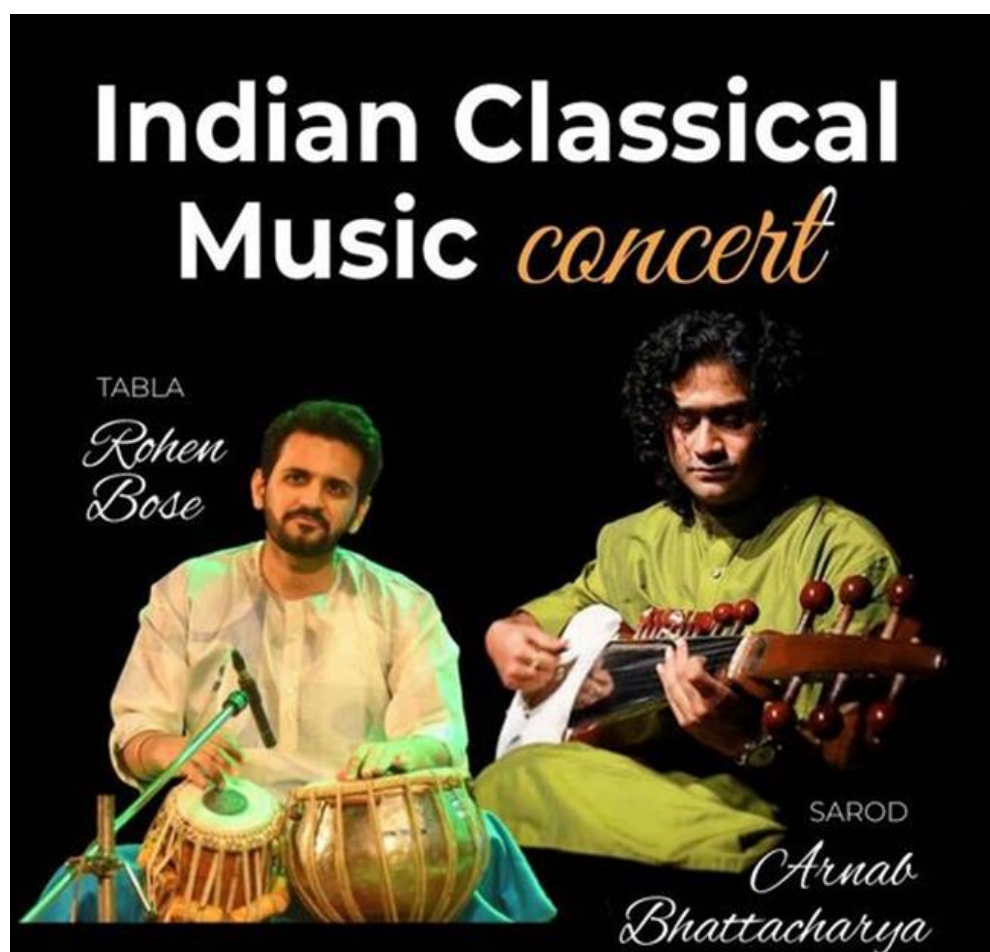
