Minister of Foreign and European Affairs, Mr. Gordan Grlić Radman, attended the Raisina Dialogue, where he participated in a panel on "Eastern Promise: The Power Shifts in EU Politics. Grlić Radman was also a guest on a podcast titled "The Three Seas Initiative at the Forefront of European Strategic Positioning", where he stressed that 3SI had to respond timely to the current food and energy crisis, as well as provide an opportunity for the countries of South Asia to import goods via the Port of Rijeka to Central and Eastern Europe. "By strengthening EU's cohesion and transatlantic ties, the 3SI countries have shown that economic growth and energy security is the backbone of EU's resilience," he underlined.

In addition, the minister held a bilateral meeting with his Indian counterpart Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, who visited Croatia in September last year. "Global circumstances have changed drastically since our last talks. I'm pleased to highlight Croatia's perspective, as a Central European and Mediterranean EU member state that is dealing with the foreign policy situation in Europe and the world in a level-headed manner," Grlić Radman said.

"When I heard that dSPACE was looking for software testers for its new product, I got in touch and was excited to have this opportunity to work with a company I admire, even though it meant moving to a completely new country, Meghana Bhaskara, an expert, describes her arrival in Croatia for software testing," said Ms Meghana Bhaskara, who moved from India to Croatia

"The hardest thing for me was leaving my family and everything I knew, but the company and colleagues were very supportive and made the transition easier for me. Now I work for dSPACE in Zagreb, Croatia, and I look forward to continuing my career in software testing in this great company," says Meghana Bhaskara.

She was born and raised in Bengaluru, which is often called the Silicon Valley of India. After completing her Master's in Computer Applications, she started her career with an Indian automotive company that used dSPACE products. Meghana has always been associated with dSPACE since the beginning of her career. However, after two years the project ended and she was transferred to another project.

As for the products offered by dSPACE, its main focus is on AURELION, a tool for sensor-realistic simulation and testing of advanced driver assistance systems and applications for autonomous driving. However, it also provides support and maintenance for MotionDesk and SensorSim, older products that will be fully replaced by AURELION in the future.

According to Meghana, living and working in Croatia is an incredible experience for her. "The people here are extremely friendly and welcoming, which made my transition a lot easier. Since English is widely spoken, I had no problems communicating with colleagues and finding my way in a new environment," claims Meghana.

"The support I received from my colleagues at dSPACE was exceptional and I felt like I had been working here for years. Their kindness and willingness to help made me feel at home and I never felt homesick," concludes Meghana.

# Women's World Boxing Championships: Nitu Ghanghas, Saweety Boora become world champions



Promising youngster Nitu Ghanghas and experienced hand Saweety Boora boxed out of their skin to overcome tough opponents in the 48kg and 81kg finals and claim their maiden titles in the World women's boxing championships at the K.D. Jadhav Hall. While Commonwealth Games champion and double World youth champion Nitu recorded a 5-0 victory over two-time Asian bronze medallist Altantsetseg Lutsaikhan of Mongolia, Asian champion Saweety stunned 2018 champion Lina Wang 4-3, through bout review, to keep her promise of improving upon her 2014 Worlds silver medal. After the 2006 edition, this is the second occasion when Indian boxers secured more than one gold medal.



India bagged a silver and a bronze in the ISSF World Cup in Bhopal, with the air pistol mixed team pair of Varun Tomar and Rhythm Sangwan clinching the second spot, while Rudrankksh Patil and R Narmada Nithin securing the third spot in the air rifle event. India has taken their medals tally in the competition to four, including one gold, a silver and two bronze. The second Indian team in the event comprising Divya TS and Sarabjot Singh missed the bronze by a point, finishing fifth with a score of 574. Reigning men's air rifle world champions Rudrankksh Patil and R Narmada Nithin, who had combined to win the gold at the ISSF World Cup in Cairo last month, finished with a bronze. The pair had a combined score of 632 in qualification and came third, thereby qualifying for the bronze-medal match against China's Zhang Qiongyue and Yu Haonan, who finished fourth with the same combined score in the 19-strong field.

Elephants Whisperers and RRR wins make this year India's best at Oscars: Here's how we fared over the years. India had reason to cheer loud at the 95th Academy Awards. 'Naatu Naatu' from RRR and the film The Elephant Whisperers created history by winning in their respective categories. 'Naatu Naatu' won in the Best Original Song' category and The Elephant Whisperers won in the Best Documentary Short Subject race, in what has now turned into a historic year for Indian cinema on the global platform.



India remains a bright spot among global economies: Mr. Piyush Goyal. Union Minister of Commerce & Industry, Consumer Affairs & Food & Public Distribution and Textiles, Mr. Piyush Goyal stated that India was in a "bright spot" despite a slew of economic issues encountered by several countries. He claimed that according to some reports, India's economy would develop at the fastest rate moving forward and that it has successfully met the Covid-19 problems while maintaining strong growth. The three-day trade and investment working group conference, headed by Commerce Secretary Mr Sunil Barthwal, aimed to address difficulties in areas such as trade, sustainability, establishing resilient supply chains, inclusive growth, and maintaining growth in the coming years. The meeting's final day included discussions about integrating micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) globally, developing efficient trade logistics, and exploiting digital infrastructure, which has been one of India's strengths in recent years.



India can become the number one automobile manufacturer by using lithium reserve in J&K: Gadkari. Union road, transport and highway minister Nitin Gadkari said that if India can use the recently discovered reserve of lithium in Jammu and Kashmir, it will become the number one automobile manufacturing country in the world. Addressing an event organised by industry body CII, Gadkari said there is a need to encourage public transport, and electric buses are the future. "Every year, we import 1,200 tonnes of lithium. "Now, in Jammu and Kashmir, we got lithium. (If) we can use this lithium-ion, we will be the number one automobile manufacturing country in the world," he said.



India's GDP to grow at 6% in FY24, inflation will moderate to 5%: CRISIL report. The country's gross domestic product (GDP) is likely to grow at 6 per cent in the 2024 fiscal amid a challenging global macroeconomic environment, Crisil Ratings said in a report. This growth rate is lower than the Reserve Bank of India's forecast of 6.4 per cent growth and the Economic Survey's projection of 6.5 per cent. "We expect India's gross domestic product (GDP) growth to touch 6 per cent in fiscal 2024, compared with 7 per cent estimated by the National Statistical Organisation (NSO) for fiscal 2023," the rating agency said in its report. The agency has attributed three reasons for this 100-basis point deceleration in the FY24 GDP estimate. First, the slowing world economy due to aggressive rate hikes by major central banks will create downside risks to the country's growth. Domestic demand, therefore, will have to do the heavy lifting next fiscal.



Respect, equality for women key to India's progress, says PM Modi. Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the country could only progress by increasing respect for women, while addressing a post-Budget webinar on the economic empowerment of women. Speaking during the 11th of a series of 12 such webinars following the Budget 2023-24 presentation on February 1, Modi said the Budget had given a new momentum to women-led development. "India can move forward only by raising the levels of respect for women and the sense of equality. I call upon all of you to move forward with the determination to remove every obstacle coming in the way of all women, sisters, daughters," he said.



#### **Ambassador's outreaches**

Ambassador Srivastava was hosted by the rector of the University of Rijeka, prof. PhD. Snježana Prijić-Samaržija with colleagues: Dean of the Technical Faculty, prof. PhD. Lada Kranjčević, dean of the Faculty of Informatics and Digital Technologies, associate professor PhD. Marina Ivašić Kos and the former dean of the Faculty of Physics, associate professor PhD. Marina Karuza. The meeting was also attended by Mladen Zlamalik and Neven Tomašić, representatives of the Croatian-Indian Friendship Society. Since the University of Rijeka signed a cooperation agreement with the Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology in October 2021, the meeting discussed the establishment of concrete forms of cooperation with the Faculty of Engineering and the Faculty of Informatics and Digital Technologies. In addition to possible forms of cooperation in the field of digital technologies, artificial intelligence, electrical engineering and computing, Ambassador Srivastava mentioned the possibility of cooperation in the field of medicine and pharmacy, and as a possible Indian partner, he proposed King George's Medical College, a public university that owes its success to sophisticated world-class biomedical research, especially in the treatment of oncological diseases.



One District One Product ODOP exhibition at the Ethnographic Museum in Zagreb continues for the past two months. Ambassador Srivastava gave an introductory tour to Croatian friends having an interest to develop business partnerships with Indian counterparts for ODOP products.



#### **Academic partnerships**

The Indian School of Business (ISB) had the honour of hosting Her Excellency Ms Kolinda Grabar Kitarovic, former President of Croatia. Professor Madan Pillutla, Dean, ISB received H.E. Ms Kolinda Grabar Kitarovic and highlighted ISB's activities and initiatives. Coinciding with the visit, ISB and Zagreb School of Economics and Management, Croatia inked a graduate student exchange agreement in the presence of H.E. Ms Kolinda Grabar Kitarovic and through online platform Ambassador Raj Srivastava. The MoU was exchanged by Professor Madan Pillutla and Dr Mato Njavro, Dean, Zagreb School of Economics and Management. As part of the agreement, the exchange students will be expected to undertake an academic program, developed in consultation between the home institution and the host institution, at the host institution as full-time, non-degree status students at the graduate level.H.E. Ms Kolinda Grabar Kitarovic hoped that through the formalised MoU, many students from ISB would visit Croatia, which she said is a gateway to Europe and could potentially open more opportunities to ISB students. Professor Madan Pillutla said that ISB is delighted to add Croatia to its student exchange programme network of 32 countries. He thanked ICCR and the Ministry of External Affairs for their support in organising this visit. H.E. Ms Kolinda Grabar Kitarovic also delivered a distinguished talk at ISB where she addressed the PGP students on 'Digital Transformation and Green Transition- Basis for a Strong India-Europe Relationship'. She spoke about India-Croatia relations and underlined the need to spearhead a partnership between the two countries in the areas of digital transformation and green transition. "Climate change is one of the greatest perils our planet has been facing and we have the obligation to take care of it and the future of our own children," she added.





At the virtual conference on the topic of cooperation between the University of Zagreb, the Faculty of Agriculture and its Indian counterparts from the State of Uttar Pradesh explored in the presence of Ambassador Srivastava several university cooperations posssilibites for strengthening the already strong academic ties between India and Croatia. The virtual conference highlighted the possibilities of connecting through exchange programs, R&D and MoU, the University of Zagreb, and the Faculty of Agriculture with 3 universities from UP, including Acharya Narendra Deva University of Agriculture and Technology, Ayodhya, UP, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel University Meerut, UP, C.S.Azad University of Ag. and Tech., Kanpur.
