

PM inaugurates Sudarshan Setu connecting Okha mainland and Beyt Dwarka island in Gujarat



The Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated Sudarshan Setu which connects Okha mainland and Beyt Dwarka island, built at a cost of around Rs. 980 crores. It is the longest Cable-stayed bridge in the country of around 2.32 Km. Sudarshan Setu boasts a unique design, featuring a footpath adorned with verses from Shrimad Bhagavad Gita and images of Bhagwan Krishna on both sides. It also has solar panels installed on the upper portions of the footpath, generating one megawatt of electricity. This bridge will ease the transportation and significantly reduce the time of devotees travelling between Dwarka and Beyt-Dwarka. Before the bridge's construction, pilgrims had to rely on boat transport to reach Beyt Dwarka. This iconic bridge will also serve as a major tourist attraction of Devbhumi Dwarka. The Prime Minister was accompanied by Governor of Gujarat, Shri Acharya Devvrat, Chief Minister of Gujarat, Shri Bhupendra Patel and Member of Parliament, Shri C R Patil.

PM Modi announces names of 4 astronauts for Gaganyaan





India introduced its first group of astronaut. They will not be the first Indians to fly into space — that distinction belongs to Rakesh Sharma — but are the first official class of astronauts as part of India's long-term program for human spaceflight called Gaganyaan. The Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi announced in 2018 that India would embark on its own human spaceflight program. Last October he laid out plans including an Indian space station by 2035 and a man on the Moon by 2040. India conducted the TV-D1 uncrewed pad abort test of their crew capsule days later. An uncrewed orbital test flight is planned this year. PM Shri Narendra Modi was at the Indian Space Research Organisation's Vikram Sarabhai Space Center in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, to bestow wings on the four "astronaut designees": Group Captain Prasanth BalaKrishnan Nair, Group Captain Ajit Krishnan, Group Captain Angad Pratap, and Wing Commander Shubhanshu Shukla. Three will fly the first mission to Earth orbit next year, which is expected to last three days. All four are Indian Air Force test pilots and have been in training for several years including 13 months at Russia's Gagarin Training Center outside Moscow. In a post on X, Modi said they "reflect the hopes, aspirations and optimism of 140 crore Indians." (A crore is 10 million.)

GAGANYAAN MISSION

INDIA'S FIRST MANNED FLIGHT TO SPACE

The project was first approved by PM Narendra Modi on August 15, 2018.

It will send the three member crew to space for at least seven days by 2024–25.

ISRO hopes to deploy its biggest rocket, GSLV MK III, for this project.

The space agency hopes to launch the first mission within 40 months from the date of approval.

It would be one of the cheapest manned spaceflights in the world, with the estimated cost of not more than Rs 10000 crore.

India plans to call its astronauts "Vyomnauts" since 'Vyom' in Sanskrit means 'Space'.

India will become fourth country after Russia, US and China to send humans to space.

Major Statements/Discussion:

Hajdi Ćenan, Airt: In AI, the emergence of multi-agent teams over individual agents ensuring more internal control is a potential area for huge opportunities. Cooperation on AI is still on individual levels, but is desirable on more institutional level. Both India and Croatia are in R&D stage in Al. Indian Al startups can come test their products and use Croatia as a 'sandbox', as it is a small EU market with good location, for testing their products and strategically moving to bigger EU markets. Croatia has nearly 100 AI startups, while some other countries are interested in block chain.

Boran Lončarić, Gdi: Regarding technological solutions in India and the challenges, India and Croatia are 'digital twins' on infrastructural processes, now enhanced by Al. Our users are from capital-intensive industries, infrastructure, and energy operation, etc. Gdi is a leader in Central Europe. Speaking on size, the size of pilot project for our cooperation with Jio in telecom sector was larger than full-fledged projects in Croatia. India offers quality engineers. In today's scenario, Indian stock market has just taken over Hong Kong's, while Croatia is one of the best-performing economies for 7 years in Europe. India and EU may jointly provide solutions to clients in Africa and Asia. A joint cooperation of Gdi, A1 Hrvatska, Vodafone and Infobip for the integration of order processing systems project is in the offing. In potential areas of cooperation with India, space image interpretation offers huge potential for EU space agency alongside healthcare and startups.

Boris Pogačnik, Infobip: Infobip's first Indian market cooperation in India was with Vodafone and now we have 200 employees in 3 States. The Indian banking industry is our next focus area. Now the trends are even reversing, as our financial and analysis manager in Istria is from India.

Frane Šesnić, ZICER: I was impressed by UPI payment system during my recent visit to Bengaluru and also TATA design studio. India is great market due to its size while Croatia offers great business opportunities due to its location between east and west Europe.

Miro Hegedić, Smion: India is a great market for startups. India's Silicon Valley Bengaluru has 34 unicorns while Croatia has only 2. Smion has 600 teams and 3000 employees. The need of the hour is Startup Bridge for the 'soft landing' of companies in India. Teamup is a great match-making platform for this purpose.

Major Statements/Discussion:

Krševan Antun Dujmović, IRMO: India is re-emerging as a strong economy, as it has surpassed most of the major economies of Europe. India has become the most populous country in the world with quality education and young people, while China is now grappling with some demographic issues and is likely to have economic backlash.

Gordan Kolak, Končar: Koncar has been in business for 100 years now with a presence in 130 countries in heavy electrical equipment. Now for past 5-7 years our Indian operations have come down due to price competition. Due to size, its challenging to operate in India which demands product customization and price competitiveness which is not economically viable for us. Now, we will be interested only in specific operation in India.

Stjepan Orešković, M+ Group: We are a 10,000-employee company in Croatia which is comparable to L&T or Tata in India in terms of size, with 98% of our operations abroad. We see great enthusiasm in the Indian market which indicates fast growth, but we feel that outsourcing is the only key for a small company like ours to meet huge demands in Indian market.

Tin Viduka, Altpro: We have 15 years of cooperation with India which is our main export market. Our strategy to enter Indian rail signaling market was to provide some specific segments in the beginning as per Indian regulations and then later on expand to other operations. We have 40 people here just for our projects in India and are just acquiring 3000 sq meters in April in Velika Gorica for new facility. With 1.2 million employees, Indian railways lays 2700 kms of railway lines each year which is double the total rail length of Croatia.

Hrvoje Čeović, Belupo: We source our pharmaceutical raw material from India and process semi-finished and raw products here. Currently we are working on exporting some products to Indian markets.

Nedjeljko Štefanić, Elproms: Our area of excellence is R&D in smart living spaces. The ceremonial opening of 500 data switches with our Indian partners in Samobor is a landmark in our cooperation, which happened

Major Statements/Discussion:

Darko Pappo, DIV Group: We were the 1st company to bring 300 people from India in 2019 to work in Croatia & now 12500 Indians are working here, which is due to the good example that we gave to other companies in the field.

Hrvoje Balen, Algebra University College: There are huge talent opportunities in education and ICT sectors in Croatia. 40,000 university graduates from Croatia have left abroad in the last 15 years. Innovation without talent is impossible. Therefore, outsourcing is the key where Croatian immigration system needs to be agile to our advantage.

Arvind Kapur, Karma Group: Food delivery business is literally taken over by workers from Indian and Nepal. We have been in this business for 20 years with our operations in Gulf while we are headquartered in Croatia for our operations in the Balkans. Skill India is a great Gol initiative where you get quality workers as per your preferences. Amit Srivastava, Anuna Skills Europe: We have been members of Skill India since its inception in 2014, which is 51% owned by the industry. Here, prospective employers have a role to play as they can do orientation of the desired skilled workers in terms of language and culture on the campus before their actual arrival here so that its a more lasting and streamlined relationship between talent and employer.

Marko Pekčec, ManPower: We issued 6000 visas to India workers last year, but still potential of white collared work force from India has not been utilized.

Closing remarks by Ambassador: Societal integration of foreign workers should be strategic priority of the Croatian government for planning for better future. I am sure a historically diversified country like Croatia can easily integrate newly coming work force from India, Philippines, Nepal and Ukraine. In good working conditions and more streamlined migration procedures, Croatia will benefit from a more skilled workforce, who will be here to stay and integrate into Croatian society with positive economic contribution.



Tesla to Enter Indian Market?

Tesla, the US electric automaker, is on the verge of entering the Indian market as the government is finalizing a policy to extend preferential import duties on electric cars valued over INR 30 lakh for 2-3 years. In exchange for this, Tesla may provide bank guarantees for its proposed investment in establishing an electric vehicle factory in India, according to sources familiar with the matter. Currently, India imposes a 100% import duty on cars valued over INR 33 lakh and a 60% duty for those below this threshold. Tesla has expressed its willingness to invest up to \$2 billion if the government grants a reduced import duty of 15% on imported electric cars during the initial two years of operation.



Europe a Priority for India: EAM S Jaishankar

S Jaishankar, the Minister of External Affairs, highlighted the paramount importance of Europe to India, highlighting the depth of the relationship during the inaugural session of the 2nd CII India Europe Business and Sustainability Conclave. He pointed out that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has visited Europe 27 times and hosted 37 European government heads. At the same time, Jaishankar has made 29 trips to Europe and received 36 of his counterparts, underscoring the enduring and continuous nature of the relationship. Highlighting recent agreements on mobility with European partners, the Minister stressed the relevance of concluding free trade agreements with the European Union and EFTA, acknowledging the need for a positive framework to accelerate trade further. On the topic of connectivity, Jaishankar suggested that beyond the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), a polar route could provide an alternative logistical pathway between India and Europe through the Indo-Pacific.



Microsoft to Train 2 million Indians in Al by 2025

Microsoft plans to train over 2 million individuals in India with artificial intelligence (AI) skills by 2025 as part of an initiative aimed at boosting job creation, according to Chairman and CEO Satya Nadella. The announcement was made during the Microsoft CEO Connection event in Mumbai, part of Nadella's annual three-day visit to India. He highlighted the commitment to equipping the workforce with the necessary AI skills to participate in the domain, highlighting the acquisition of skills and the job opportunities that will be generated. Referring to data from the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Nadella pointed out that out of the US\$ 5 trillion GDP target set for 2025, around US\$ 500 billion would be attributed to AI. He noted the transformative potential of AI in making sense of digitalisation and introduced the neural reasoning engine as a new capability applicable to an increasingly digitised world. Puneet Chandok, President of Microsoft India, and South Asia, highlighted the vast potential for AI innovation and adoption in India, with 100 new startups emerging daily.



India's economy surges further ahead in February

The Indian economy, which expanded at a four-month high in January, continued to strengthen in February, seeing accelerations in both manufacturing and services sectors during the month. The latest flash PMI numbers, based on a survey of 400 manufacturers and 400 service providers, follow data showing a robust 7.6% growth in the Indian economy in the second quarter. This growth was supported by increased government spending and strong performance in manufacturing, mining, and construction, apart from the services sector. "The pace of acceleration in the output of India's manufacturers and service providers, combined, was at a seven-month high in February. Encouragingly, new export orders rose sharply, particularly for goods producers," said Pranjul Bhandari, chief India economist at HSBC.

Did you know?



Early forms of chess originated in India around the 6th century AD in the Gupta Empire. Its ancestor, "Chaturanga," a Sanskrit name for a type of battle formation, found its mention in Mahabharatha. Chaturanga was a popular four-player war game that had several critical aspects of modern chess. There are several similarities between this old game and modern-day chess. For example, there are different pieces in both games, and they have different powers. Also, victory was based on only one piece, aka the king in modern chess. By the 7th century, Chaturanga (the word is based on the four commanding wings of an army), the earliest known precursor of modern chess, was flourishing in northwestern India. Travellers, saints, artists, and kings took some version of Chaturanga to Persia on the Silk Road, where the name of the "King" in Sanskrit, "Rajah," changed to Persian "Shah". All the European names of the game have roots in the Persian language. French "Echec," and English Checkmate all originated thanks to their Persian roots. At the same time, Buddhist pilgrims are known to carry it towards the East. Where several versions of the games (inscribed discs placed on the intersection of the lines of the board rather than within the squares. By the 11th century, it reached Japan and Korea. In conclusion, Chaturanga played with dice on a 64-square board and gradually transformed into shatranj (or chatrang). Source.

India in Karlovac






